Personal Statement

Why I would like to become a parent governor: -

I am currently a Co-opted Governor of Beaumont Primary School in Coulsdon which is the school that both of my children attended before coming to Riddlesdown Collegiate. I serve on the Curriculum and Standards committee with a particular responsibility for the teaching of mathematics and enjoy the role of being part of a team that ensures educational and other standards are maintained. I have both observed lessons and also given a 40 minute lesson aimed at connecting the subjects taught to year five with real world careers so that the students could make connections between learning and their future working lives.

I spent 10 years as a teacher of English as a Foreign Language to adults both in the UK and Spain. This culminated in running a Nord Anglia summer school in London with responsibility for student safety, teaching performance and organising outings. Through the summer we had 300 children and adults attend the school from all over the world.

I have worked in the training and development field for the last 20 years and specialise in working with senior teams of SMEs. Part of this has involved dispute resolution at board level and presenting to hostile audiences. I regularly incorporate HR policies into the training programmes I design, such as recruitment and interviewing skills.

From 2013 – 2015 I volunteered as a Young Enterprise business coach and was assigned to Dartford Grammar School for Girls where I mentored several start-up businesses, all of which made a healthy profit! In particular I worked with them on their presentations prior to the regional competition finals. Mostly recently I have been a judge on the “Speak Out!” challenge sponsored by the Jack Petchey Foundation.

I currently work for Dale Carnegie Inc. which is a global training company specialising in training adults in the areas of communication, presentation, sales, leadership and people development. We work with businesses, charities and county councils all over the south-east of England.
