Dear Parents/Carers

Whilst students' behaviour at the Collegiate remains strong, we recognise that the impact of the disruption over the past 2 years has meant that some students have fallen out of the good habits that are essential for their success. We always want, and teach, students to do the right thing because it is the right thing, and the emphasis we place on our VALUES supports students to make the right choices. However, we recognise that sanctions and consequences for poor choices can play an important role in helping students make good decisions. Therefore, as part of our ongoing work to maintain our outstanding behaviour and standards, from Monday 10th January we are introducing two new detentions:

1. Social Supervision
2. Whole School Daily Detention

Social supervision will take place every day during break and lunch. Students may be placed in social supervision for repeated infringements of the uniform policy, poor punctuality to tutor time, poor behaviour report scores or behaviour outside of the classroom that falls below our expectations.

Whole school daily detention, which will replace the weekly College Headteacher's detention, will take place every day for one hour. Students who arrive late to school after tutor time with no valid reason, are removed from lessons for disruptive behaviour or whose behaviour in social supervision is unacceptable, will receive a whole school detention after school on that day. Parents/Carers will be emailed at 13:00 to inform you if this is the case.
