- Experience adventure

Structure

Levels:

- Bronze
- Silver
- Gold



Sections:

- Skills
- Volunteering
- Physical Recreation
- Expedition



Key Points:

- You can choose to start a new activity or work on an activity that you already enjoy.
- “You don’t have to be good, you just have to get better”.
- Involvement may be through extra-curricular clubs and activities provided at school or elsewhere.
- Guidance and advice can be given by leaders but the Scheme relies on self-motivation by participants.



This covers interests or hobbies such as:

- Art

- Playing a musical instrument

- Cookery

Requirements for Skills, Volunteering and Physical Sections

- △ You must complete a **minimum of 15 hours** over a minimum of 3 months on each section.
- △ You must complete an **additional 15 hours over 3 months** on the volunteering section and one other section.

Requirements for Skills, Volunteering and Physical Sections

Time requirements for participants who have not previously completed Bronze Award

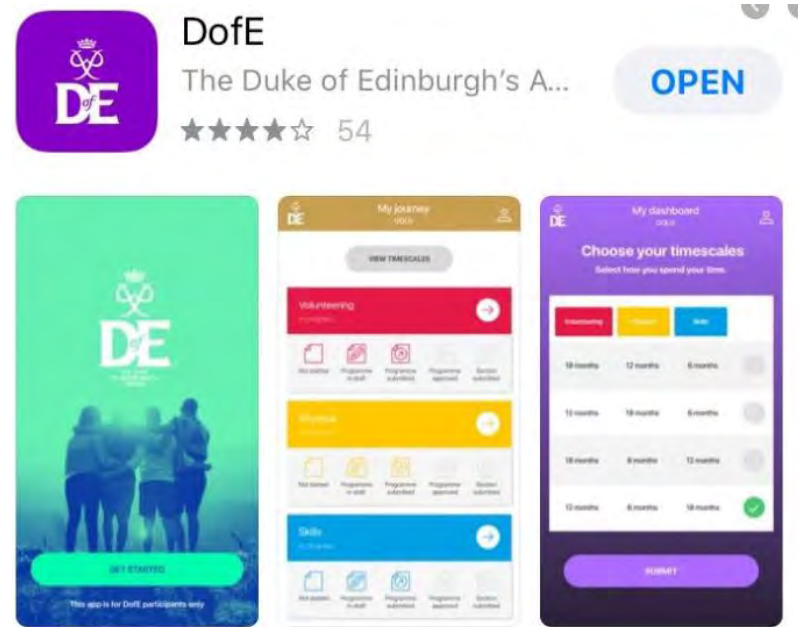
- ⚠ You must complete a **minimum of 15 hours** over a minimum of 3 months on each section.
- ⚠ You must complete an **additional 15 hours over 3 months** on the volunteering section or one other section.
- ⚠ You must complete an additional 6 months and 30 hours on the remaining section

3 – 6 – 12 split

Expedition

This is the only activity which is specifically organised by the school.

You will receive training in:

-  Route planning and map skills
-  Navigation
-  Camp craft
-  Equipment
-  Safety Procedures and Basic First Aid



Expedition

You will:

- 📍 Attend route planning sessions after school
- 📍 Attend a training morning
- 📍 Complete a 3 day Training Expedition
- 📍 Complete the 3 day Assessed Expedition

All components need to be completed to fulfill this section.



Expedition

The Training and Assessed Expeditions will involve you:

Working as a team of 4 – 7 people



Silver - Planning a 30 mile walk over 3 days Navigating your group on the walk



Carrying all you need for 3 days including:

- Your food
- Your clothes
- Your bedding
- Your tent

What you need to do next

Each College has been allocated 25 places

- Skills that you already have
- Skills that you would benefit from developing
- Commitment and organisation
